I. Worldly thinking results in <u>self-exaltation</u> (vv. 24-25).
 A. The disciples argued about their <u>standing</u> (v. 24).
 B. Jesus confronted them as being <u>sinful</u> (v. 25).

II. Righteous thinking results in <u>service</u> (vv. 26-27).
A. Jesus instructed that leaders are to <u>sacrifice</u> (v. 26).
B. Jesus reversed their thinking of the <u>status quo</u> (v. 27).

III. Future thinking results in <u>surrender</u> (vv. 28-30).
A. The disciples had seen Jesus <u>suffering</u> (v. 28).
B. Jesus promises His disciples will be <u>satisfied</u> (vv. 29-30).
