- I. A <u>letter</u> is sent to explain the situation (vv. 25-30).
 - A. Lysias presents himself in the best possible <u>light</u> (vv. 25-27).
 - B. Lysias determines the accusations are about Jewish <u>law</u> (vv. 28-30).

- II. The <u>Lord</u> arranges for Paul to be moved (vv. 31-35).
 - A. Paul is <u>led</u> to safety (vv. 31-32).
 - B. Felix <u>learns</u> about Paul's home area (vv. 33-35).

- III. A <u>lawyer</u> is sent to present charges (vv. 1-9).
 - A. Tertullus lavishes praise on Felix (vv. 1-4).
 - B. Paul is accused of being the <u>leader</u> of a religious sect (vv. 5-8a).
 - C. The accusations are presented as <u>legitimate</u> (vv. 8b-9).
