 I. The journey to Rome <u>starts</u> (vv. 1-8).
 A. Paul is afforded the <u>support</u> of friends (vv. 1-3).

B. The journey is a <u>struggle</u> (vv. 4-8).

II. The conditions are not good for <u>sailing</u> (vv. 9-12).

A. Paul <u>shares</u> his concerns (vv. 9-10).
B. The harbor is not <u>suitable</u> (vv. 11-12).

III. The ship faces an extreme <u>storm</u> (vv. 13-20).
A. The sailors <u>submit</u> to the storm (vv. 13-17).
B. They lose all hope of being <u>saved</u> (vv. 18-19).

IV. The outcome is <u>subject</u> to God's will (vv. 21-26).

A. Paul promises that they will be <u>spared</u> (vv. 21-22).

B. Paul is reminded that he will <u>stand</u> before Caesar (vv. 23-26).
