- I. Job understands God's <u>awesome</u> power (vv. 1-10).
 - A. Job cannot stand against God (vv. 1-3).
 - B. Job knows that God acts alone (vv. 4-10).

II. Job thinks God is not <u>accessible</u> (vv. 11-24).
A. Job feels God is <u>avoiding</u> him (vv. 11-13).
B. Job has no <u>answer</u> for God (vv. 14-18).
C. Job <u>assesses</u> God as mighty (vv. 19-24).

- III.Job is desperate for an <u>arbitrator</u> (vv. 25-35).
 - A. Job is <u>afraid</u> of further suffering (vv. 25-31).
 - B. Job knows he cannot <u>argue</u> with God (vv. 32-35).
