C. He says that they speak <u>falsely</u> (vv. 7-12).

II. Job's <u>faith</u> in God does not waver (vv. 13-19).
A. He wants to have a <u>face</u> to <u>face</u> with God (vv. 13-16).

B. He wants to be treated <u>fairly</u> (vv. 17-19).

III. Job wants the issue <u>finalized</u> (vv. 20-28).
A. He does not want to <u>fear</u> the meeting (vv. 20-22).
B. He wants to know his <u>faults</u> (vv. 23-28).
