Job 31 p. 437

- I. Job's life was <u>pure</u> (vv. 1-12).
 - A. God was his portion (vv. 1-4).
 - B. He kept his path from evil (vv. 5-8).
 - C. He purposed to remain faithful (vv. 9-12).

- II. Job was polite toward others (vv. 13-23).
 - A. He did not show partiality (vv. 13-15).
 - B. He shared with others plentifully (vv. 16-23).

- III. Job's relationship with God was a <u>priority</u> (vv. 24-34).
 - A. He is not deserving of punishment (vv. 24-28).
 - B. He did not take <u>pleasure</u> in wickedness (vv. 29-34).

- IV. Job desired to bring his <u>petition</u> to God (vv. 35-40).
 - A. He wanted to <u>present</u> his case (vv. 35-37).
 - B. He was just in <u>protection</u> of the land (vv. 38-40).

We would all do well to take an inventory of our own lives:

- How are you doing with your thoughts?
- Do you treat others with decency and respect?
- Are you generous with those who are less fortunate?
- Do you see your assets as resources to be used for God's glory?
- Is your relationship with God a priority?
- Do you reach out to show hospitality to others?
